Papers are invited for the National Seminar. Papers should be based on practical study, experience or research in actual working environment and should be prepared as per Guidelines for Preparation of Papers. Practicing engineers and technologists are specifically encouraged to participate.

Papers are solicited in the broader areas of Environment, Water Sharing, Climate Change, Industrialization, Energy, Communication, Infrastructure, Construction Materials, Disaster Management, Quality Management, Quality Assurance and Agriculture. The authors must have an explicit discussion on the role and coherence of regional cooperation in advancing the knowledge, professionalism and social benefits in these broad areas. Thus, the contents and conclusions of the presentation must depict the role of the area of your interest/specialization in materializing the benefits of regional cooperation. On broader sense, the paper must represent the theme of the Seminar. Best papers presented in the national seminar will get special appreciation from the editorial board.

GUIDE LINES FOR PREPARATION OF PAPER

1. The language of the National Seminar shall be English.

2. The paper shall be typed single spaced on A4 paper, typed on one side only using MS Word 97 or higher version leaving margins of 40 mm on top and left side and 30 mm on the right and bottom. Total length of the paper should not exceed 10 pages including figures, tables etc. A soft copy of the paper in compact disk should accompany three hard copies of full length paper.

3. Title of the paper should be in capital letters and centred. This should be followed by four spaces and then by the names and addresses of the author(s).

4. The text of the paper should be divided into major Sections and Sub-sections including the Abstract and the Introduction parts. The a logical observations and the conclusions derived by the author(s) should be presented at the end of the paper in Conclusion section. References cited in the text may be listed alphabetically at the end of papers. The word REFERENCES should be capitalized and centred above the list of references.

5. Multimedia projection system will be available during the presentation.

It has history dating back to earliest time. and, the exact date of its foundation is not known. However, according to recorded history it was founded in 1608 A.D. as the seat of the, Imperial Mughal Viceroy of Bengal.

Dhaka as the capital of Bangladesh has grown into a busy having a happy blending of old and new architectural trends. Dhaka has been developing fast as a modern city and is throbbing with activities in all spheres of life. It is the centre of industrial, commercial, cultural, educational and political activities for Bangladesh. At Tongi, Tejgaon, Demra, Pagla, Kanchpur; the industrial establishments turn-out daily necessities. Motijheel is the main commercial area of the city. Dhaka's major waterfront Sadarghat is on the bank of the river Burigang and is crowded with all kinds of river craft, yachts, country boats, motor launches, paddle-steamers, fishermen's boats all bustling with activities. Colourful rickshaws (tricycles) on the city streets are common attractions for the visitors.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Area: 1528 sq. km., Population: Fifteen million, Climate: Tropical, with heavy rainfall and bright sunshine in the monsoon and warm for the greater part of the year. The winter months, from November to March, are however, most likeable, cool and pleasant. The maximum and the minimum temperatures during summer are 36.7°C and 21.1°C; whereas in winter they are around 31.7°C and 10.5°C, respectively. The annual rainfall is 2540 mm. The voltage of electricity throughout Bangladesh is 220 volts.

A series of field trips will be arranged during the Convention. The tour program covers different tourist attractions and engineering installations located in and around Dhaka City. Pre-registration to the Annual Convention is a pre-requisite for attending these field trips.
